GOING FOR A GILL

TIP IT! was once a popular game in Chipping pubs, but it has gradually decreased since the end of the Second World War. The players are divided into two teams usually from 2 to 6 people each side. Each team appoints a captain. The game is played with a "piece", which can be anything- a small coin or even a piece of matchstick. The aim of the game is to win the piece. One team holds the piece, and the opposing team challenges to find it. Usually the players decide at the outset how many games to play --eg. the overall winners to be the team who are the first to win 10 games. All members of the team holding the piece put their hands under the table or behind their backs, and pass the piece around in a bid to deceive the opposing team. When the piece is in the decided hand, their captain says, "Up and close 'em". Then they all put their clenched fists on the table.



The opposing captain then chooses each member of his team in turn to find the piece by tapping each closed fist with a challenge of "Take it off", or "Tip it!". All challenged hands must be shown palm uppermost. "Take it off" is the challenge (hopefully) to try to eliminate empty hands. But if the piece is in a hand challenged by "Take it off", the challenging team has lost that game. "Tip it!" is the challenge used only when a player suspects he knows which hand has the piece. However once "Tip it!" has been called, the game must end, the challenging team winning if the piece is there, losing if it is not.

The game is more of a pastime than a gamble, but it is occasionally played for a round of beer.
