COTTON SPINNING

IN CHIPPING 1866

The two water-powered cotton spinning mills in Chipping had already incurred expensive repairs following a cloudburst and flooding on 1st July, 1851. Both mills had apparently introduced steam power to supplement water power, despite the cost of having to haul coal to such isolated places. But the end came with the "Cotton Famine" slump, when supplies of raw cotton were virtually unobtainable as a result of the American Civil War. Many uneconomic cotton mills such as those in Chipping never recovered.

The Saunder Rake works became an iron and brass foundry, and Kirk Mill became a chairworks.

Both these advertisements were in the Preston Chronicle. They have been copied exactly, using the original spelling and punctuation.
