

# A Simplified Version of the Family Tree of the PROCTERS of WOLFEN HALL FARM and WOLFEN MILL, Chipping, Lancashire.

This version only names the main male lines. The Chipping Local History Society has much more information, and will be pleased to accept more, about the Procters or other local families, and to help with enquiries. The Procters were very numerous around Wyresdale and Barnacre. This family tree refers only to the Procters who came to Wolfen Hall Farm and Wolfen Mill.

NOTE that Timothy Procter who ran Chipping Mill (now the Waterwheel Restaurant) from about 1910, and later Brick House Farm, was born in Barnacre in 1830.

He was one of a large family including Mark who ran Longridge Dairy, John who ran Goomargh Mill, and James who farmed Birks, Thornley (see page 39). More research needs to be done on this branch of the Procters, but at present they do not seem to be related to the Wolfen Hall Procters.

By coincidence, Timothy and his family used Wolfen Mill for cheese-making from about 1934. In 1968 their Wolfen Mill Dairy Co. moved to the dairy on Goose Lane formerly run by Miss Knowles (see pages 14 + 15).
